Institutional Policy on Environment and Energy Usage

Objectives:

- 1) To develop learners the skills and aptitudes necessary to understand ecological issues and take necessary actions.
- 2) It includes strategy of making awareness of creative, dynamic, effective, and efficient environmental protection and management responsibilities.
- 3) It helps to build knowledge and skills necessary to address complex environmental issues, as well as ways we can take action to keep our environment healthy and sustainable for the future.

Institutional initiatives:

M. B. More Foundation's Arts, Commerce and Science Women College has been promoting environmental awareness through campaigns and activities. This includes activities such as tree planting, clean-up drives, and awareness campaigns on different environmental issues. These activities can help learners understand the importance of taking care of the environment and encourage them to take action. It also helps to realize our responsibilities and commitment to conservation of natural resources and to limit its usage.

1. Tree plantation drives

Like green spaces, gardens participate in the protection of biodiversity; for example, by providing food and habitat for bees and other pollinators. Beyond attracting fauna, gardens help improve the quality of our air and cool down built environments by enabling reverberation and evapotranspiration.



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Considering these benefits, institution conducts plantation drives on and off the campus with the help of students and employees on several occasions. The students are motivated to participate and also to take care of the saplings.







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2. Cleanliness drives

A cleanup program can not only reduce pollution, but – by sorting neighborhood trash and recycling as much as possible – can help to teach residents about recycling and about activities that will reduce the neighborhood's carbon footprint. The crucial benefits are:

The students are made aware of these benefits through regular cleanliness drives conducted through NSS unit in the campus and at adopted village on several occasions.









3. E-waste recycling campaign

M. B. More Women College participated in the 'E-waste collection drive' organized by Bhausaheb Nene Arts, Commerce and Science College, Pen.

All students of the Women Colleges were informed about this campaign and collected the electronic waste in their house/ locality which is dangerous to the environment. The Women College has collected about 44.10 kg e-waste and sent to e-waste recycling agency at Mumbai.
