


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The College

M. B. More Foundation's Arts, Commerce and Science Women College have grown as a shelter for girls students seeking for higher education in Roha taluka. The Management of College has been named after Late Mr.Mahadevrao Bhaurao More was father of Hon. Mr.Vijayrao More, President and Founder of M. B. More Foundation Samajik Seva Sanstha.

After H.S.C., girl students didn't have access to higher education nearer to Roha-MIDC. Girls were either used to go Nagothane, Ashtami or Kolad, all these places 10 km far from MIDC and hence need expenses on travelling. So most families in villages, daughters of MIDC workers forced to left their education after H.S.C. Hon. Mr. Vijayrao More initiated the idea to open up senior College for girls. In July 2012, the College was started on no grant basis in the premises of Dhatav



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With this humble beginning, the management established a new Junior College, affiliated to Maharashtra State Board for boys and girls in 2016. This is quite convenient for girl student to take an education at Higher Secondary and graduation level under the same roof. M. B. More Foundation today has grown into a big educational complex imparting quality education to students with rural background.

These Colleges are on prime location on the Roha – Kolad road. About 2.5 acre area and two floors of the building are provided by the management for College purpose. The atmosphere in the campus is fresh and pleasant.

The site is near to *Kundalika*river which is beyond the building ground of 2000 sq. mt.

The College have been equipped with separate laboratories for Chemistry (Instrumental and Non-Instrumental), Botany, Physics and Zoology. All laboratories constitute essential instruments, equipments, chemicals and glasswares. The entire curriculums based on practicals in Junior College as well as at graduation course have been practiced smoothly in each term of the academic year.

The College maintains a well stocked library with about 2000 books which includes textbooks, reference, magazines and about 6 newspapers. The library stock has proposed to register on software in the next academic year. There is a separate reading section provided for teachers and students.

Our College had made necessary arrangement such as Administrative Office, Examination Control Room, Lecture Halls, Principal's Cabin, Seminar Hall, Store room, Record Room, Staff room etc. The whole campus is under CCTV surveillance which is quite satisfactory from the point of view of student's security. So most families in villages, daughters of MIDC workers forced to leave their education. Hon. Mr.Vijayrao More initiated the idea to open up senior College for girls. M. B. More Women College had a humble beginning with only 21 students in first year batch. Its success led to the commencement of the Junior College, affiliated to Maharashtra State Board for boys and girls in 2016. The present total strength of our Degree College and the Junior Section about 700 students. The College has consistently attained outstanding results in academics at both Degree & Junior levels.

Examination System

I) XI Arts, Commerce and Science Junior College

- The results of the Class XI will not be decided on the marks obtained by a student only in the Annual examination. Equal weight will be given to the performance of students in assignments, tutorial examinations, oral examination, practical and project work (whichever is applicable), the internal evaluation and written examinations. The final results will be based on the average marks secured by a student in these examinations.
- Oral Examinations : Oral examinations are introduced in few subjects (all languages, all subjects in Arts faculty and all subjects in Commerce faculty) at class XI and XII levels from June 2006. Taking oral examinations as per scheduled timetables is compulsory for all students.

(Theory: 80 Marks) + (Oral: 20 Marks) = 100 Marks

 Practical Examinations : Appearing for Practical examinations in Science subjects (Physics, Chemistry, Biology) as per scheduled timetables is compulsory for all students. Absentees will have to appear for re-examinations only on payment of a fine fixed by the authorities.

(Theory : 70 marks) + (Practical : 30 Marks) = 100 Marks

- In case, a student misses any examination for any reason (such as on medical ground), he/ she must make a written application to the Principal along with documentary evidences in proper time.
- There shall be no re-examination in case of students who fail in class XI.
- 20% of questions in final examination should be included from the 1st Term syllabus.

Bachelor of Arts (B.A.)

M. B. More Women College is affiliated to Mumbai University. It offers three year integrated course in Arts, leading to B.A. degree awarded by the University of Mumbai.

Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) is an under graduated course that students pursue right after their class 12th Humanities. Our college offers specialization as B.A. (History)(6 Units), B.A. (History)(3 Unit) and B.A. (Marathi)(3 Unit).

After completing B.A. course candidates can pursue M.A. course in the same discipline in which they pursued their graduation. However, aspirants can also opt to pursue a job right after completing their B.A. course.

B.A. syllabus is broken into six semesters and continuous evaluation is done in each semester. The Choice Based Credit and Grading System (CBCGS) has been implemented at the Mumbai University for all the under graduate (UG) programmes under the faculty of Arts, Commerce and Science from the academic year 2011-12.

First Year Bachelor of Arts (F.Y.B.A.) Semester I

Eligibility :

A candidate for being eligible for admission to three-year integrated programme leading to the degree of Bachelor of Arts must have passed the Higher Secondary School Certificate (Std. XII) Examination conducted by the different divisional boards of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education with the following subjects –

- 1. English
- 2. Any one of the modern Indian languages or modern foreign languages or any classical language or information Technology
- 3. Any four subjects carrying 100 marks each

OR

The Choice Based Credit and Grading System (CBCGS) has been implemented at the Mumbai University for all the under graduate (UG) programmes under the faculty of Arts, Commerce and Science from the academic year 2011-12.



First Year Bachelor of Commerce (F.Y.B.Com.) Semester I

Eligibility :

A candidate for being eligible for admission to three-year integrated programme leading to the degree of Bachelor of Commerce must have passed the Higher Secondary School Certificate (Std. XII) Examination conducted by the different divisional boards of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education.

OR

Must have passed the Higher Secondary School Certificate (Std. XII) Examination with vocational subjects/ minimum competency based vocational programme conducted by the different divisional boards of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education.

# Guidelines for Admission

# A) RULES FOR ADMISSION

- All admissions are given on merit basis as per the rules and regulations of University of Mumbai & Government of Maharashtra. A student seeking admission to the college should present her with an application in prescribed form duly filled in and signed by him and by her guardian at Admission committee.
- No admission will be regarded as granted, unless it is enrolled at University to get sixteen digits PRN.
- All admissions are valid only for one academic year and are required to be renewed with application in the prescribed form for the new academic year.
- Once a student is admitted will be considered as duly admitted for the academic year, unless he informs the Principal in writing of her intention to leave the college at least a week before the commencement of the Second term. If such intimation is not received, full fees for the second term will have to be paid.
   For online admission for F.Y.B.A., F.Y.B.Com. andF.Y.B.Sc., computer facility will be available in the college.

# **B) DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR ADMISSION**

While seeking admission to the First Year Bachelor in Arts, Commerce and Science for a regular student must submit the following documents duly completed :

- 1. Duly filled in admission form.
- 2. Original Marksheet of H.S.C. Examination along with three attested copies of the same.
- 3. School Leaving Certificate / Transfer Certificate with one attested copy of the same.

4. An attested copy of the Marksheet of S.S.C. Examination.

5. Two passport sized recent colour photographs with sign behind of one.

- In other cases, it is necessary to produce :
- Statement of Marks of the last all examination passed for the admission to T.Y.
- Statement of Marks of First and Second Semester examinations for the admission in S.Y.
- Eligibility certificate in the case of students having passed examination of other than Mumbai University.
- Students belonging to SC / ST / NT / OBC may be admitted to the college without tuition fees on furnishing proof of Caste Category.
- No Objection Certificate (NOC) and Transfer Certificate (TC)
- If a student has passed first /Second year examination in other college & wants the admission to Second /third year, she has to submit the No Objection Certificate (NOC) from the College last attended.
- Admission will be on provisional basis until Online Transfer Certificate (T.C.) is received by the College. Within one year she has to present the Online Transfer Certificate bearing PRN and Transfer Code from the college last attended.
- Migration Certificate to be submitted by the students of Universities other than Mumbai University.

# **Examination** System

From the Academic year 2016-17 onwards revised format of 'Choice Based Credit & Grading System' (CBCS) with 10 points grading is incorporated by Mumbai University in all courses. The Academic Council at its meeting held on 30th September, 2016 decided to implement the Uniform 10 Point Grading System for all courses except for faculty of technology. The grading system is considered to be better than the conventional marks system and hence it has been followed in the top institutions in India and abroad.

#### Semester System and Choice Based Credit System :

The Indian Higher Education Institutions have been moving from the conventional annual system to semester system. Currently many of the institutions have already introduced the choice based credit system. The semester system accelerates the teaching-learning process and enables vertical and horizontal mobility in learning. The credit based semester system provides flexibility in designing curriculum and assigning credits based on the course content and hours of teaching. The choice based credit system provides a 'cafeteria' type approach in which the students can take courses of their choice, learn at their own pace, undergo additional courses and acquire more than the required credits, and adopt an interdisciplinary approach to learning, It is desirable that the HEIs move to CBCS and implement the grading system.

#### Key Words in CBCS :

- 1. Academic Year: Two consecutive (one odd + one even) semesters constitute one academic year.
- Choice Based Credit System (CBCS): The CBCS provides choice for students to select from the prescribed courses (core, elective or minor or soft skill courses).
- 3. Course: Usually referred to, as 'papers' is a component of a programme.

All courses need not carry the same weight. The courses should define learning objectives and learning outcomes. A course may be designed to comprise lectures/ tutorials/laboratory work/ field work/ outreach activities/ project work/ vocational training/viva/ seminars/ term papers/assignments/ presentations/ self-study etc. or a combination of some of these.

- Credit Point: It is the product of grade point and number of credits for a course.
- Credit: A unit by which the course work is measured. It determines the number of hours of instructions required per week. One credit is equivalent to one hour of teaching (lecture or tutorial) or two hours of practical work/field work per week.
- 6. Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA): It is a measure of overall cumulative performance of a student over all semesters. The CGPA is the ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses in all semesters and the sum of the total credits of all courses in all the semesters. It is expressed up to two decimal places.
- 7. Grade Point: It is a numerical weight allotted to each letter grade on a 10point scale.
- 8. Letter Grade: It is an index of the performance of students in a said course. Grades are denoted by letters O, A+, A, B+, B, C, D and F.
- 9. Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA): It is a measure of performance of work done in a semester. It is ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses registered in a semester and the total course credits taken during that semester. It shall be expressed up to two decimal places.
- 10. Semester: Each semester will consist of 15-18 weeks of academic work equivalent to 90 actual teaching days. The odd semester may be scheduled from July to December and even semester from January to June.

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# Infrastructure & Learning Resources

M. B. More Foundation's Arts, Commerce & Science Women College is present at the Ground floor and First floor of the building of Hon. Pandurang shastri Aathavle Ayodyogik Vidyalaya in Dhatav premises. Our Management has provided extensive infrastructure for the College purpose and numerous resources for learning. The Ground and First floor of the building constitute 36 rooms that are used for various purposes. Our Management have also constructed a wide Auditorium for the multiple activities of College as well as School.

**Campus**: Two plots from Dhatav premises comprising about 10,526 sq.mt have been provided by the Management for educational purpose. There is beautiful, well maintained garden at the main gate of College that adds glory to the campus. A wide playground behind the building and the *Kundalika* river beyond it enhances the uniqueness of institute.

**Class rooms** : For College purpose about 10 Class rooms are provided on both floors. These rooms are spacious, well ventilated and are equipped with teaching aids such as desks, benches, Chalk board, LED projectors, screen, educational charts and models

Laboratories : There are separate laboratories for each subject such as Chemistry (Instrumental), Chemistry (Non-Instrumental), Botany, Zoology / Physics in our institute. All of them are equipped with sophisticated instruments which are well maintained. Safety in each laboratory is taken care of at a high priority. Our Management has appointed one Laboratory Assistant and an attendant for its maintenance.

**ICT for teaching :** LED projectors and screen are installed in 10 classrooms for teaching purpose. While teaching theoretical subjects, teachers are strictly instructed to use PPT on respective topics. Teachers lso use multimedia for presentation including You-tube clips and allow a students to

respond critically to the main ideas, implications, strengths and limitations of presentations.

**Seminar Hall**: One wide room with adequate capacity have been provided for College use at the Ground floor of the building. This room equipped with a projector screen, Canon projector and laptop. Our teachers took number of Sessions regularly on projector for enhanced delivery of curriculum.

Library : The College maintains a well-stocked library with about 5000 books which includes textbooks, reference, magazines and about 6 newspapers. Our Management had appointed a Librarian for its maintenance. The library stock has proposed to register on software in the next academic year. There is a separate reading section provided for teachers and students.

**Play ground** : About 2000 sq. mt. wide playground behind the College which is an ideal one. Our College have provided separate kit to the students for outdoor and indoor games. The incharge of Sports committee keeps an update of students' practices and even about the maintenance of sports material as well as playground.

**I.C.T. Lab**: One Room equipped with 25 Computers and internet facility have been provided by our College for students as well as Staff through which users are introduce to the world of unlimited stock of knowledge and innovative concepts. This laboratory is open for College members who have provided login for their use. The responsibility of its maintenance have been given to one of the staff member.

**Excursions & Industrial Visit :** The coordinator of Science Faculty arranges a visit at one of the Industry at MIDC in the month of January – February of every year for the students from Second and Third year of

B.Sc. Such visit to Industrial zone enhances the confidence in Students for the curriculum which is based on practicals. The Department of History also organises visit to Historical places around Roha Taluka. . In the upcoming years, the Science faculty also planning of a visit to Botanical garden, planetarium and observatory.

**Guest lectures** : In each half of the academic year one subject expert as guest lecturer from nearby College get invited at our College for a guidance session in every faculty. This helps in recall of the curriculum as well as incorporation of new ideas into the mind of students. Our teaching Staff also gets a chance to learn innovative ideas from the guest.

# Code of Conduct

Self-discipline is the best discipline. All the students are expected to observe the rules and regulations, in force to enable the smooth working of the college.

  - violates the code of conduct will be severely dealt with.
- They will treat the college property with great care and consideration they will not make any mark on the furniture or on the walls. Any damage or destruction of the college property will be punishable individually or collectively.
- 8. Students are forbidden to organize or attend any meeting within the

college or collect money for any purpose from students and outsiders or to circulate among the students any notice or petition of any kind or paste it on the college notice board without written permission of the Principal.

- 9. When the teacher enters the classroom, the student must rise remain standing till they are directed to sit down. When the attendance roll is called, each one must rise to show their presence. Students who are absent from classes for two weeks or more at a stretch, without the permission of the Principal in writing, will be considered to have left the college. Students remaining absent for more than two days, for any reason (Personal/co/extracurricular activities) have to submit the leave application duly signed before proceeding for leave.
- Mobiles are strictly prohibited in college campus. If found it will be forfeited.
- 11. Students are expected to be seated in their respective classrooms at the stroke of the first bell and wait for the teacher. Action will be taken against students found loitering in the corridor making noise. They should make use of the Library during free periods.
- 12. Students have to park their vehicle at the parking only. Movement of vehicles in the college campus shall be in a moderate speed only.


